EYFS and Year 1 & 2 – Miss Allwood

This week in class 1 we have enjoyed wrapping up our different topics this half term.

KS1 have made some absolutely fantastic glove puppets, they tried so hard to create these and we had a lovely day trying.

EYFS have also been having lots of fun, we have been exploring turn taking using games and practicing going one at a time and following the rules. They have then been able to use these skills when playing with their friends outside.



Y3,4,5,6 – Miss Jackson

This week in Key Stage 2, we have been writing our narratives that we planned last week in English. Years 3 and 4 have been working on adding direct speech and inverted commas into their work, and the years 5 and 6 have been working on adding some parenthesis to their work. In maths, the Year 6's have been practising some SATs style questions, whilst also looking at multiplying fractions, Year 5's have been practising multiplying 3 – digit numbers by 2 – digit numbers, Year 4's have been practising multiplying 3 – digit numbers by a 1 – digit number, and Year 3's have been consolidating their learning on multiplying and division.

In Computing this week, we have been looking at how to spot a fake / scam email and what we should look out for. The children were really engaged with this lesson highlighting the parts of the email which proved it was not real. In PSHE, we have been looking at respect and what that word means. We looked at different scenarios and acted them out that reflected our class, whilst talking through them to establish how we could show respect in each situation.

Wrap Around Care Update

We wanted to let you know in advance that governors are currently reviewing the pricing of our wrap-around and after-school clubs. Like many schools, we are experiencing rising staffing costs and increases in essential resources and sundries needed to run the clubs safely and sustainably.

To ensure we can continue offering high-quality provision, it is likely that there will be a price increase from April 2026. At this stage, no decisions have been finalised, and we will share the confirmed prices with you as soon as the review is complete. We are letting families know early to support planning and avoid any surprises.
