EYFS and Year 1 & 2 – Miss Allwood

This week we have been learning all about plants. In Reception, the children have been exploring the life cycle of plants and have enjoyed planting their own seeds. We talked about what plants need to grow and how we can look after them.

In Year 1, the children have also been learning about planting and have been writing their own instructions for how to plant a seed, thinking carefully about the steps needed and using words such as first, next and finally. We are looking forward to watching our plants grow over the coming weeks!

This week in KS2, in English we have finished our recount writing, and we are moving onto writing a police report. This week we have been exploring police reports and crime scene images, based off of our story 'The London Eye Mystery'. In Maths, we have been completing some assessments, Y4's have also started their new topic of fractions, and Y5 and 6 have been finishing their topics ready to move on next week.

In Music, we have been listening and identifying different techniques used in our focus piece – Imagine by John Lennon.
