## Wow Class work



### **EYFS and Year 1 & 2 – Miss Allwood**

EYFS have had a great start back and have settled back into routines nicely. We've enjoyed revisiting the plants we grew before the holidays, looking closely at how they have changed and comparing their heights. The children have been really engaged in talking about what plants need to grow.

Year 1 & 2 have made a strong start to our new class book, *The Magic Finger* by Roald Dahl. They have been really interested in the story so far and are keen to keep reading to find out what happens next.



### **Y3,4,5,6 – Miss Jackson**

This week in Key Stage 2, we have started reading our new class text 'the Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe', which we have really enjoyed. We have also started identifying features of a setting descriptions ready to begin writing our setting descriptions next week.

In Maths Y4 have continued with their fraction's topic, we have been looking at converting improper and mixed number fractions. Y5 have completed the fractions topic and have now moved onto decimals, we have been looking at the relationships between decimals and fractions. In Y6 they have also finished their ratio and proportion topic and moved onto algebra. We have been looking at 1 and 2 step function machines so far.

In RE, we have been learning about 'The Lord's Prayer', and what each line actually means. We have also looked at writing our own prayers by thinking about what we are thankful for and what we might need to ask for forgiveness for. In our SPAG lessons this week, Y4's have been learning about different word classes and what they mean. Y5/6's have been revisiting parenthesis and have been including this in other lessons when we have been writing as well.
