This week, Year 1 have really enjoyed learning about money in Maths. They have been using our class shops to explore the value of different coins, recognise them and work out how to pay for different items.

In EYFS, we have been learning about sea creatures and have been designing our own fish ready for our sewing project. The children have shown fantastic creativity and are looking forward to bringing their designs to life.

This week in KS2, in English we have been practicing our play lots, and trying to learn our lines off by heart ready for our play, which is creeping closer. In Maths Y4 have been continuing with their money learning and been succeeding with this. Y5 have been learning about the different types of angles and how to use a protractor. Y6 have been finishing their learning about perimeter, area and volume, they have done really well with this as it is not an easy topic.

In Music, we have been learning our songs for the play, this week we have been singing them without the backing singer, so the children needed to learn the songs ready for the play. In PSHE, we have been looking at stereotypes, and bias, and understanding how these are

A reminder that parents have the right to withdraw their children from the teaching of sex and relationships education that goes above and beyond the science curriculum.

The science curriculum currently covers with our year 6 children -

How our bodies change as we age, often referring to physical changes due to hormones.

The process of reproduction in plants and birds.

This does not cover reproduction itself in detail and does not reference mammals.

The areas of PSHE that go beyond this for a year 6 child is sexual reproduction in humans. This is a lesson that parents can choose to withdraw from should they wish to. If this is the case, then please refer to our RSE policy on our website for more information about this process.

Sensory Toys in School

To ensure that pupils receive the most appropriate support, we kindly ask that sensory toys are **not** brought into school unless they have been agreed with the school for a specific sensory purpose.

Different children have different sensory needs, and it is important that any sensory resources provided are matched to a child's individual sensory-seeking behaviours. To help us identify the most appropriate sensory support, the school will complete a sensory evaluation if we identify sensory behaviour, and parents/carers will also be asked to complete the same evaluation. This information will enable the SENCO to assess the child's sensory needs and determine the most suitable sensory strategies or resources to support your child.
