Lessons take place during school time in a small groups or individually. Having regular lessons, coupled with playing at home, enables children to progress by learning exciting tunes and songs.

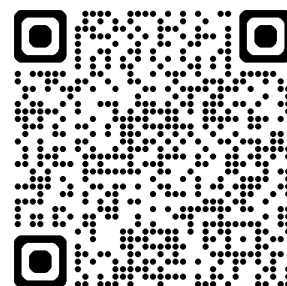
